## Quilt Sales

This will be the first time we will be facilitating the sale of exhibited items at our Heart of the Redwoods Quilt Show. Twenty-seven quilts and two garments are being offered for sale by their makers. The majority of sale items are medium sized quilts. There are also a few large (5) and a few small (5) quilts with some very beautiful wall hangings in each category. For sale items will be marked by a green tag with the price displayed. Quilt makers/sellers receive 75% of the sale price and select one of the three guilds (REQG, Eel River Valley Quilt Guild, Moonstone Quilters) to receive 25%. Buyers are required to pay sales tax on their purchases; credit cards, debit cards and checks are accepted. No purchased items may be removed until the end of the show. Shipping will be offered to out of town buyers. Invite your friends who might be in the market for a wonderful quilt. Here is your chance to purchase a unique item from one of our many awesome quilters.

A quilt will be claimed in the same building, where it was hung. We will not be responsible for shipping/returning quilts out of the area, unless you have made arrangements.

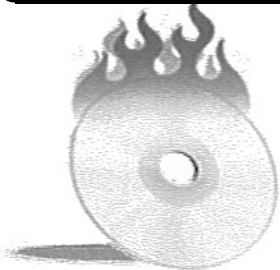
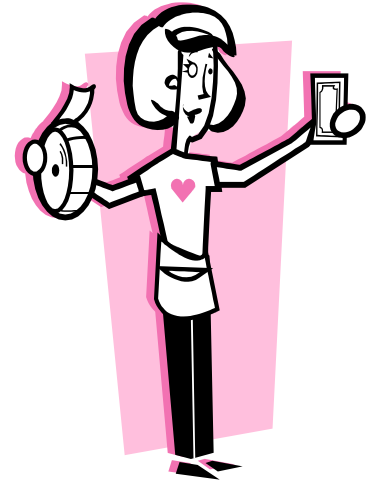
### **REQG Members Challenge Exhibits**

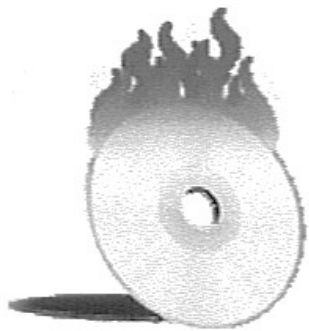

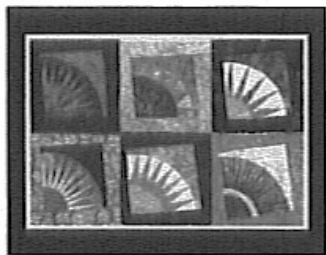

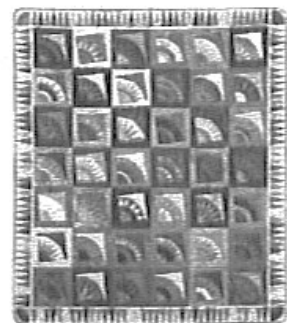


Quilt, Sunrise Moods. The note cards sell as a package of 5 for \$6.00.

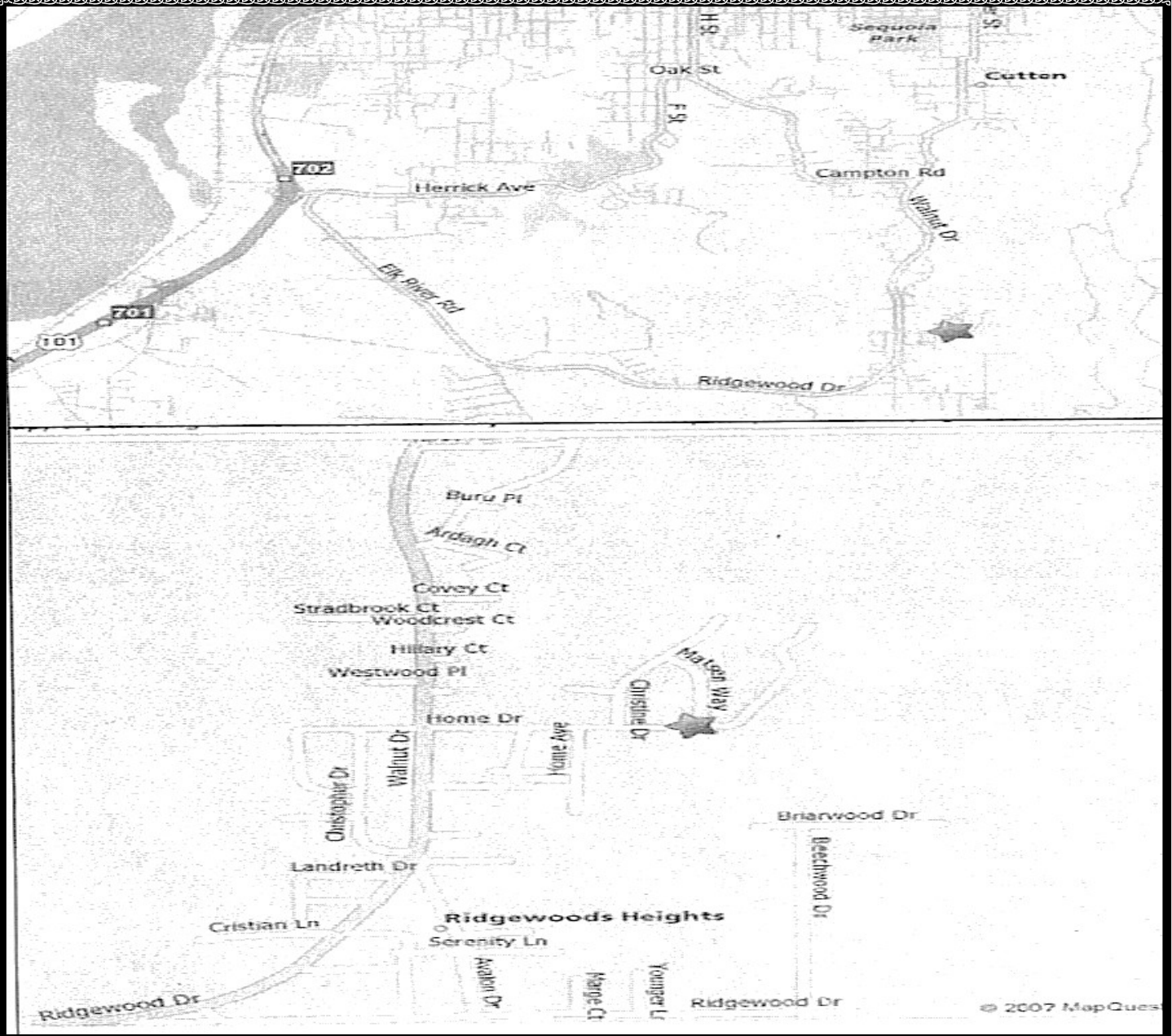
# RECEIVING QUILTS

## JT's Star ~ Block #4

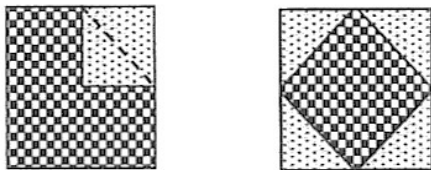
All piecing is done right sides together with a scant  $1/4''$  seam allowance unless otherwise stated. Press in the direction of the arrows.

### Cutting Instructions

-  Fabric A: cut 2 -  $6\ 1/2''$  squares  
4 -  $4\ 1/2''$  squares
-  Fabric B: cut 4 -  $2\ 1/2''$  squares
-  Fabric C: cut 2 -  $6\ 1/2''$  squares
-  Fabric D: cut 1 -  $4\ 1/2''$  square

### Step #2 - square in a square unit

Draw a diagonal line, on the wrong side of the 4,  $2\ 1/2''$  fabric B squares. Place the fabric B squares, one by one on the corners of the fabric D,  $4\ 1/2''$  square. Stitch **on the line**. Press triangles away from the center. Trim away center layer of fabric to reduce bulk. (press and trim after stitching each triangle)



### Step #1 - quarter square triangle units

Draw a diagonal line, on the wrong side of the 2,  $6\ 1/2''$  fabric A squares. Pair the fabric A squares, with the 2,  $6\ 1/2''$  fabric C squares. Stitch  $1/4''$  on each side of the drawn line. (fig. a) Cut apart on the drawn line and press seam towards the darker fabric. (this unit is called a half-square triangle)

Draw a diagonal line on the back of 2, half-square triangle units. Pair these with the remaining 2 half-square triangle units right sides together, with seams opposing each other and butted up tightly together. Stitch  $1/4''$  on each side of the drawn line. (fig. B) Cut apart on drawn line and press seam either direction.

Using a square ruler with a 45 degree line, (place the line on a diagonal seam) square the quarter-square triangles to  $4\ 1/2''$ . Be sure to square up so the center intersection of the block remains centered and the seams end at each corner. (fig. C)

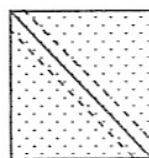

Pencil and cutting lines

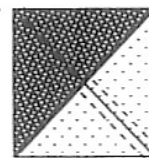

### Final Step

Along with 4,  $4\ 1/2''$  fabric A squares, piece block units together into horizontal rows. Stitch rows together to complete the block. The block should measure  $12\ 1/2''$ .
