Board Members Present: Sherrill Adams, Linda Barry, Tedd Collins, Judy DeGraff, Susie Freese, Judy Gallamore, Carol Hansen, Barbara Hotelling, Lorna Mathews-Jensen, Gazella Wike, Sharon Stewart and Maggie Stimson.

President Maggie called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. Maggie welcomed and introduced Sherrill Adams (co-1st Vice President) and Sharon Stewart (new Community Liaison). Correspondence was read and passed on to appropriate committee members.

Treasurer Barbara Hotelling distributed the financial reports. Rent has been paid for three months to Redwood Acres (fee includes set up and take down). The Treasurer's report was approved.

Officers and Committee Reports: **1st Vice President** Lorna distributed a proposed program schedule for the upcoming guild year and asked for suggestions. Susie volunteered to give a program at the next meeting, titled "Digging Out Your Sewing Room." A trunk show for recently deceased charter member June Bryant may be part of our program at our December potluck meeting. The silent auction will be in January. A suggestion was made to have "Featured Teachers" as a program. Sharon had some new ideas for activities at the Christmas potluck. She will put an article in the next newsletter about this.

Minutes from the May meeting were read by Judy and approved. Minutes of the August meeting were approved.

2nd Vice President: A report was given in Nancy's absence. Signups went well for the November workshops. Faith Center is available for the workshops. There is some confusion on how class registrations and payments should be received (at meetings vs. post office). Maggie will ask Nancy to clarify our protocol at the next board meeting.

Awards: Judy will speak to Susan at the county fair office about problems encountered while judging.

Community Liaison: Sharon was given a general background and update on our community quilts program. Needed supplies are at the storage unit. She will put an article in the next newsletter. Susie bought a 50-yard roll of batting for community quilts.

Library: Susie bought 19 new library books on her recent trip, at a cost of \$118.16. They will be available at the next meeting.

Membership: Pat was absent due to illness. Prior to the last meeting, REQG had 54 members (49 renewing and five new or returning members), two business members and one junior member. Judy had no idea how many renewals were turned in at last week's meeting, but there were about six new members. Incoming registration forms and fees were given to Barbara. She will process the fees and send the forms to Pat to process. It was affirmed that registrations need to be received by October 15 for members to be listed in the new roster.

Newsletter: Linda Barry has some big problems with newsletter software vs. new computers. She WILL find a solution and with Jean's help, get the next newsletter out on time!

Publicity: Not present. **2009 Opportunity Quilt:** A workshop is scheduled for February 2008. Carol asked members to donate batik fat quarters in very bright or dark colors. A newsletter article is forthcoming.

Quilt Show: A Chairperson is needed. **(A hard act to follow.)**

Block of the Month: Not present.

Challenge Quilt Committee: Not present. A new committee was formed at the last meeting, consisting of four remaining charter members: Helen Saunders, Edith Goggin, Pauline Pire and Dorothy Cowan.

Carole reported that she has 150 **Doll Quilts**, with our goal set at 300. Yvonne Jolley and Kim Gunderson will take over this committee in January.

Fat Quarter and Historian: Not present.

Hospitality: Gazella will discontinue brewed coffee, as most of it is thrown away. She will provide hot water, instant coffee, tea, etc. Kim Harris will help in October, as Gazella will be out of town. Gazella asked for help in reorganizing the storage room at Redwood Acres.

Ted reported that the **Raffle Table** made \$117.00 in September. That is a good month!

Show and Tell and Sunshine: Not present.

Minutes continued:

HAF: As follow-up to the last board meeting, \$3695.00 is available for our next grant period. Nola will soon send a letter to HAF, outlining our grant procedures.

Old Business: Suggestions for fund-raising activities during a non-show year were discussed. Quilt raffle for a special event (car show, etc.); garden tour, sewing room tour. Maggie will try to recruit help for such an event.

Maggie shared her concerns over the Standing Rule regarding Audit Committee appointments and the schedule for our annual audit that was approved at the May board meeting. Maggie was not present at that meeting. She will bring a revised proposal to the next board meeting.

Maggie closed the meeting at 8:40 p.m.

Did you read the label on the Quilt Show CD when you picked it up? On the label are instructions for getting a file with the detailed descriptions of all of the quilts if you wish to have that information. It is in an easy to read PDF file in order by entrant's name. Using the Adobe PDF reader (which is free and usually already on any computer when it is purchased) you can search for title, entrant, or for any word of interest. There is no cost for receiving this file.

New members probably don't know that Susie is past president, co-chair of our quilt show this summer, current librarian, long-arm quilts a lot of the community quilts, etc., just about everything.

Also, the Viewer's Choice Winners in the REQG Quilt Show 2007 need to remember to bring their quilts for Show & Tell. Jody Rusconi remembered and brought her quilt in September; maybe she can bring it again for this showing.

DOLL QUILT SEASON

Many of you have turned in doll quilts so we have a good start. But we still need more to make our goal of three hundred doll quilts by the end of our December meeting. The families who qualify for help from the Salvation Army and Toys for Tots truly enjoy selecting a small quilt to go with the doll or stuffed animal that they plan to give to their child for Christmas. We encourage this because we think that having a doll quilt encourages the child to practice nurturing. Imagine a child wrapping or hugging a doll or bear with your doll quilt.

Those of you who saw the doll quilts displayed at our September meeting know that the vast majority are simple and easy to make. We encourage you to do what you like. Just make them measure somewhere between 18" X 18" to 28" X 28" square. You can use batting, or flannel for batting. They can be finished envelope style or bound. A child will adore whatever you make. At our October and November meetings Carol Hansen will have kits as well as boxes of strips for those of you who want them. Larger fabric pieces will also be available for quilt backs.

So, put aside a couple of hours and make a doll quilt or two. It is a good time to try something new or practice. Discarded blocks can be enlarged with borders to make an easy doll quilt. Here is a good place to use some of those scraps you are accumulating. Member Carolyn Biles remarked that she likes to make doll quilts because there is a reasonable beginning and end; she can see the finished product right away and that is satisfying. TEXTILE GRANT FELLOWSHIPS AVAILABLE

Each year the Redwood Area Quilters Guild deposits funds into our account at the Humboldt Area Foundation for our grant fellowship program. With the interest earned from this account the guild provides grants and fellowships to textile artists. We encourage any guild member to apply for one of these grants to further their education or skill in the area of textile arts. If you have been looking at a workshop or class, but didn't feel you could "afford" the opportunity, think about applying for one of our grants. Income level is NOT a criterion for receiving one of the grants. One important criterion is that you are able to use your new found knowledge/education to give back to the community and to the guild.

Direct Complements— Orange and Blue
 Colors directly opposite on the color wheel

Complementary Fall Pumpkins
 REQG Block of the Month October 07
 EASY Fusible APPLIQUE

— 8 1/2" block unfinished

Read through instructions before you begin

- Paper Backed **Fusible**, like wonder under, 6" square
- **Orange** scrap fabric *solid, print, or mottled*
 (other color for stem if desired)
- **Blue** cotton fabric *solid, print, or mottled*-8 1/2" square
- Draw a simple pumpkin shape on the paper side of the fusible taking up most of the 6" square –also draw a stem if desired –
 (*don't make this hard—just sketch it out*)
- Iron the pumpkin fusible to the wrong side of an ORANGE cotton fabric
- Iron the stem fusible to the wrong side of a fabric of your choice of color
- Cut on the drawn line, then remove the paper backing (*score paper with a pin for easy removal*)
- Place (*roughly centered*) pumpkin and the stem onto the blue fabric and press
- Sew around cut edges of pumpkin/stem to secure—using zigzag, buttonhole stitch, or other decorative stitch as desired (by machine or by hand)
