Triple Star ~ Block #8

All piecing is done right sides together with a scant 1/4" seam allowance unless otherwise stated. Press in the direction of the arrows.

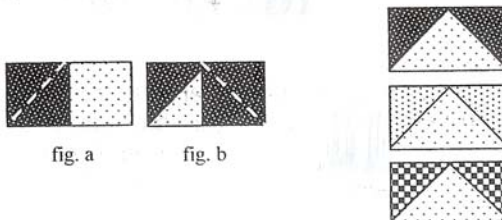
Cutting Instructions

-  Fabric A: cut 4 - 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" rectangles
4 - 2" x 3 1/2" rectangles
4 - 3 1/2" squares
4 - 2" squares
4 - 1 1/4" x 2" rectangles
4 - 1 1/4" squares
-  Fabric B: cut 8 - 2" squares
-  Fabric C: cut 8 - 3 1/2" squares
-  Fabric D: cut 1 - 2" square
8 - 1 1/4" squares

Step #1 - flying geese units

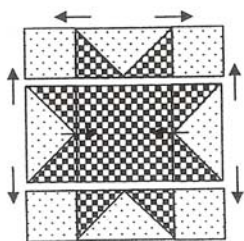
Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the 8, 3 1/2" fabric C squares, the 8, 2" fabric B squares, and the 8, 1 1/4" fabric D squares. Place a 3 1/2" fabric C square on the corner of a 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" fabric A rectangle. Stitch on the diagonal line. (fig. a) Do this with the 4 fabric A rectangles. Press triangles away from the center. Trim away back layers of fabric to reduce bulk. Repeat on the opposite corner. (fig. b)

Repeat this same process with the 2" fabric B squares and the 4, 2" x 3 1/2" fabric A rectangles, also the 1 1/4" fabric D squares and the 1 1/4" x 2" fabric A rectangles. Piece 4 of each fabric combination.



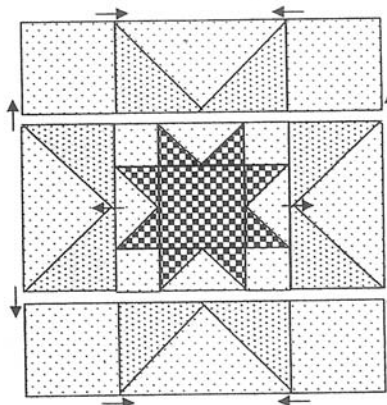
Step #2 - star center unit

With the A/D flying geese, 2" fabric D square and 4, 1 1/4" fabric A squares, piece together the units as pictured below. Begin by piecing the horizontal rows then stitch the rows together. The star should measure 3 1/2" square.



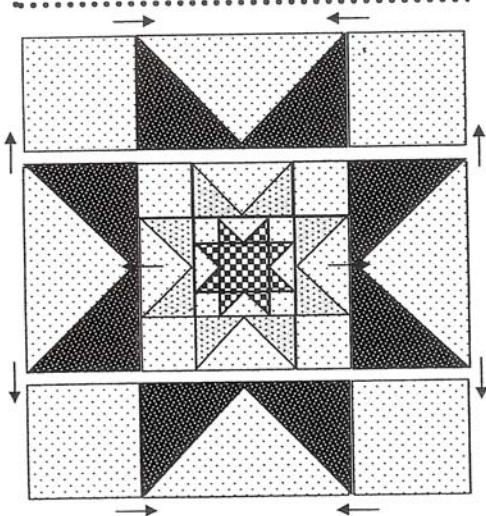
Step #3 - middle star addition

With the star center unit, A/B flying geese, and 4, 2" fabric A squares, piece together the units as pictured below. Begin by piecing the horizontal rows then stitch the rows together. The star should measure 6 1/2" square.



Final Step

Along with 4, 3 1/2" fabric A squares, piece block units together into horizontal rows. Stitch rows together to complete the block. The block should measure 12 1/2".



Block of the Month News

The lucky winner of the November blocks was Gerry Barker. Gerry won ten blocks. She can make two more and have enough for a whole quilt top. Keep those blocks coming.

I will have a new sample up in January. This will be the same pattern we have been working on, but will be done with 1930 reproduction fabrics. I know this might not be everyone's favorite fabric palette, but it will show you how fabric choices can make a quilt look completely different.

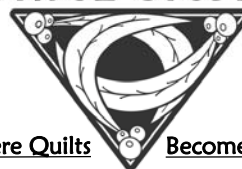

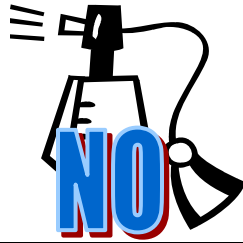
