## Moonstone Quilt Guild Relay for Life Team Ready to Go!

Our team has expanded this year as Nancy Ambrosini, Judy DeGraff and Rae Pillor have joined returning members Ann Anderson, Janet Fesler, Linda Glaros, Ila Westfall, Carol Weaver and Christine Ross (chairperson). Note that many of the members of the Moonstone team are also members of other guilds.

We have already met and set some important dates for our fundraising events. First of all, our quilting retreat weekend is scheduled for **Sat. and Sun. March 6 - 7, 2010**. This is a wonderful opportunity to spend a weekend quilting with friends and having magnificent meals cooked for you! The cost will be \$100 for the 2-day event, and all money raised will go to Relay for Life (ACS). The quilt will be a kaleidoscope, strip pieced type pattern similar to the "Magic Hours Quilt" on the Quilts Calendar 2010. Good news: This quilt can be made from fabrics you have on hand, as it is all made with 20" strips cut into 1 1/4" to 2 1/2" widths. Call Chris or Judy if you are interested in signing up. Space is limited, and a deposit will be required.

Our biggest event, the annual quilt auction and fabric sale, will take place the evening of June 23<sup>rd</sup> at Azalea Hall in McKinleyville. We welcome the support of our wonderful guild members as we seek donations of fabric for the sale, including 5-inch squares from all your leftover project fabrics. Other quilt related items will be accepted as well.

We will soon begin selling raffle tickets for *Joyce's Ever-Blooming Friendship Garden Quilt* which was made in Joyce Zeiters' honor shortly before she died and includes blocks that she completed herself.

## Community Quilts

Greetings and salutations! Winter is a great time to work on community quilts, as well as your own projects, with all the cold wet days. By now we will have had our first Community Sew Day at Ocean Waves Quilt Store on Jan. 23<sup>rd</sup>. I hope lots of you came and had fun with us and either finished or at least got a good start on a quilt top.

Fortunately for our community, only one family lost all their possessions and home in the Jan. 9<sup>th</sup> 6.5 earthquake that hit the north coast. I was able to communicate directly with the family and provide them with a Queen sized quilt, a toddler size "I Spy" quilt, and a darling baby quilt for their unborn baby within days of reading about their plight in the paper. They were very grateful, and I was happy that we were able to be of assistance. It was a real wake up call though. Our community closet of quilts is very bare, and it's time to step up to the plate and fill that void. We can't do it without the help of the all of our guild members.

We have a lot of tops, large and small, ready for quilting, and hopefully by now the batting will have arrived from Vermont, or West Virginia, or wherever it came from! If you can take a small quilt and quilt it on your home machine, or have a long arm and want to help, please call me.

We need more donations of good, recent fabrics and backings. Please make sure that your donations are clean and usable. If you have a kit out, please finish it or bring it back for someone else to sew.

The next big event for Community Quilts is the April Guild Meeting, Thursday April 1<sup>st</sup>. The program is "Community Quilts," so get ready to SEW! I would like to have at least 8 sewing stations set up, each with: one ironing pad/board, 2-3 sewing machines, a "design area," cutting mat, and lots of creative energy. The Community Quilts Committee will provide pre-cut kits with directions, or use your own ideas/imagination and our kits to help create beautiful quilt tops for our community with our kits and fabric. Please call me, Sherrill Adams to sign up to bring: an iron, ironing board/pad, sewing machine, cutting mat, scissors, thread, seam rippers (I never need that one, ha ha), a UFO, fabric, etc. Our goal is to finish 16 tops! With pre-cut kits, and lots of participation, I think we can meet this goal! Make the effort to come to this meeting, and show the true spirit of the "Heart of the Redwoods".

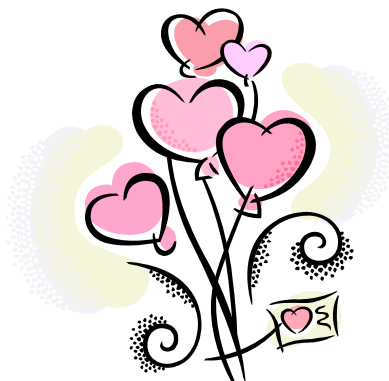

Crowning Star ~ Block #10

All piecing is done right sides together with a scant 1/4" seam allowance unless otherwise stated. Press in the direction of the arrows.

Cutting Instructions

-  Fabric A: cut 4 - 3 1/2" squares  
8 - 2" x 3 1/2" rectangles  
20 - 2" squares
-  Fabric B: cut 4 - 6 1/2" x 2" rectangles  
8 - 2" squares
-  Fabric C: cut 12 - 2" squares
-  Fabric D: cut 1 - 3 1/2" square

Step #1 - flying geese units

Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of 8, 2" fabric C squares and on the 8, 2" fabric B squares. Place a 2" fabric C square on the corner of a 2" x 3 1/2" fabric A rectangle. Stitch on the diagonal line. (fig. a) Do this with 4 of the fabric A rectangles. Press triangles away from the center. Trim away center layer of fabric to reduce bulk. Repeat on the opposite corner. (fig. b)

Repeat this same process with the fabric B, 2" squares and the remaining fabric A, 2" x 3 1/2" rectangles. (these will be used in step #3) Piece 4 of each fabric combination.

Step #2 - crown units

Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of 8, 2" fabric A squares. Place a 2" fabric A square on one end of a 2" x 6 1/2" fabric B rectangle. Stitch on the diagonal line. (fig. a) Do this with all 4 fabric B rectangles. Press triangles away from the center. Trim away center layer of fabric to reduce bulk. Repeat on the other end with the remaining 4, 2" fabric A squares. (fig. b) Piece 4 (fig. c)

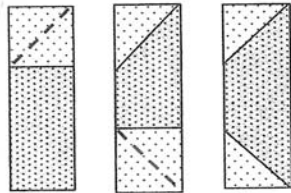
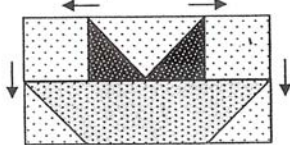


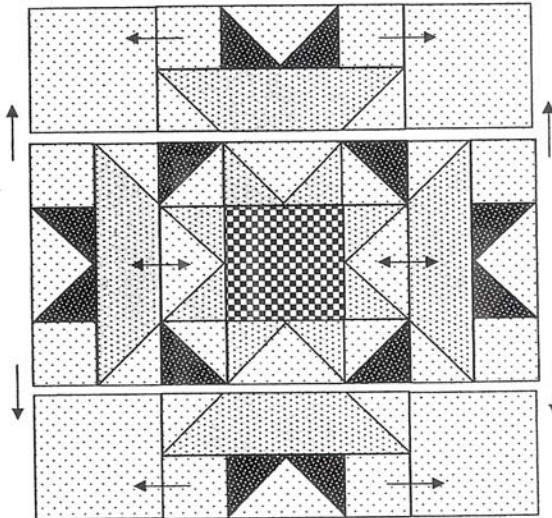
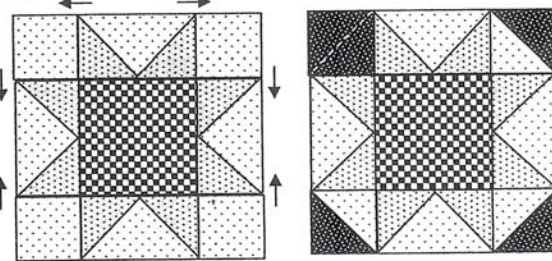

Stitch a 2" fabric A square on each side of a fabric A/C flying geese unit as pictured in the first row below. Join the flying geese row with the unit pictured above. Piece 4



Step #3 - center unit

Piece center unit together into horizontal rows. Stitch rows together. Lastly, draw a diagonal line on the back of the remaining 4, 2" fabric C squares. Place one on each corner, and stitch on the diagonal line. Press away from the center. Trim away the center layer to reduce bulk.



Final Step

- Along with 4, 3 1/2" fabric A squares, piece block units together into horizontal rows.
- Stitch rows together to complete the block.
- The block should measure 12 1/2".

**Block of the Month**

Congratulations to Betty Hendrickson for winning the five blocks that were turned in last month. Let's keep those blocks coming. I'm glad to see that all of you liked the new sample I had up. I'm sure Jennifer Duncan is enjoying the quilt she won last month.

We only have a few blocks left to make, then we start on the sashing and borders. You will get all the instructions you will need to finish your quilt by our last meeting.

## REQG 2010 Challenge – The Year of the Animal Quilt



*Pick any animal that you wanna,  
Be it dogs or birds or an iguana.  
Use piecing, fusing, or appliqué,  
Anyway you do it is okay.  
But, be aware that one has to be able to spot,  
The color orange and the polka dots.  
The size of the quilt is yours to decide,  
But no more than 45" to a side.  
We hope you're excited to make one,  
Because it will be a lot of fun.*



### Challenge Rules:

The Challenge entry can be of any shape, but the combined total of all sides of the quilt cannot be less than 80" or more than 180." Entries must be quilted and finished with a hanging sleeve. Three-dimensional entries are allowed.

Entries may be pieced, appliquéd, or mixed techniques; or a combination of techniques may be used.

Orange fabric and some polka dots must be used.

You do not need to keep your design a secret from your quilting friends, but you cannot show it at a REQG meeting or Show and Tell prior to the 2011 meeting.

The animal must be recognizable. Animal print fabric cannot be counted as the animal but may be used to make the animal.

Call to order: Betty Hendrickson called meeting to order at 6:33 pm.

We had a quorum and approved the November minutes. Helen Saunders/Susie Freese first/second respectfully and followed by a unanimous yeas vote.

**Treasurer's Report:** See separate page. Lynne paid the sales tax today.

**President's Report:** Peggy Boedecker has had to resign from Parliamentarian position due to health concerns. Have announced opening at January general meeting but have no responses yet. Position will serve through June 2011. Have completed the contract with Redwood Acres for 2010. Have first Thursday of month except for month of November, which will be the second Thursday.

**First Vice-President:** \$550 was donated to Miranda's Rescue along with bedding, food, and toys. \$600 went to Friends of the Library. Cheryl deposited the cash and wrote checks to each facility. Got some ideas after attending Moonstone Quilter’s community sew and they had stations and kits, which made the event run smoothly. Planning article for upcoming newsletter. Need volunteers to bring sewing machines and irons. Discussion followed concerning need for table risers and ironing pads. Susie will check at Market for ironing pad material and REQG can invest in making some pads for such events.

**Librarian:** Nothing new purchased. Donations made but some of those items donated to raffle table. Susie will pick up Banner books at Market per Charlotte’s request.

**Membership:** January meeting - 105 members and 10 guests. Charge was \$3 for guests. Total membership in 2009 was 159. Maggie does not have a current total count.

**Newsletter:** All articles are due by midnight, January 15.

**Publicity:** Have sent announcements to all local newspapers but have only seen it in Times-Standard. Mary will get a media list from Sherrill to send out PSAs to TV and radio stations as well.

Next will be February 8 at Betty’s home in Arcata.

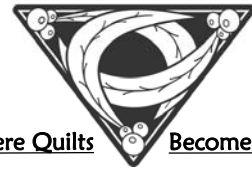
